
Horse Racing Ireland (HRI) is the national authority for thoroughbred racing in Ireland, with responsibility for the governance, development and promotion of the industry.


Irish Horse Racing Regulatory Board

- **▼** HRI Racing Juniors:
 - HRI Racing Juniors is an initiative from Horse Racing Ireland, providing a platform where children can learn more about horses in a child-centred way.
- The Road To Racing Primary School Programme:

 Four part video series about horseracing taught by jockey Danny Mullins bringing pupils on a journey through horse racing. Worksheets for all class levels included.
- Agri Aware Dig In Equine Modules:
 "Dig In! Learning about Life on the Farm and Countryside" is an interactive agricultural curriculum designed by Agri Aware for primary school students.
- Junior Academy:

 Free one day course at the R.A.C.E for 10 to 16 years who are dreaming of becoming a jockey or riding a racehorse. Riders are grouped by their age and experience so that everyone is of a similar level of ability. Includes practicial riding training, strength & coniditioning.
- From Foal To Race Transition Year Programme:

 12-week (1 hour per week) programme, both teachers and students will gain insight into the horse racing industry with a strong focus on increasing awareness of the careers that feature throughout the foal to race story.
- ITBA Next Generation:

 Junior wing of the ITBA, aimed at students and young breeding enthusiasts. They provide a platform to educate young people with an in-depth insight into the thoroughbred industry. Join today to access exclusive events, opportunities, and networking.



The Racing Academy & Centre of Education

The Racing Academy & Centre of Education is the national training academy for the Irish horseracing industry offering courses for jockeys, trainers, stable staff, breeders and others in the thoroughbred industry.

Trainee Jockey Course (Level 4):

The world-renowned Trainee Jockey Course has been running since 1977. A large number of graduates are leading successful careers in every aspect of the racing and breeding industry around the world. The most important attributes to help gain a spot are a love for horses, a high level of fitness and a good attitude.

Junior Academy:

There are several Junior Academy days every year for young people aged from 10 to 16 years, with a dream of becoming a jockey. They are free days funded by equuip. Riders are grouped by their age and experience so that everyone is of a similar level of ability. Activities for each day are planned around each level of experience and RACE aim to make these days a lot of fun. Places are limited to 10 riders per academy day.

How to become a Jockey

To become a professional jockey, you must first become an experienced exercise rider and groom in a racing yard. Talent alone is not enough to become a jockey; exercise riders have to earn the support of a trainer to begin the process of applying for a license.

Types of jockeys:

- Apprentice Jockey
 An apprentice jockey rides on the flat
 Must 16 years of age.
 Should not weigh more than 9st (126 lbs).
- Conditional Jockey
 A conditional jockey rides in National Hunt races.
 Must be 16 years of age.
- Qualified Rider

 Those applying for a Category A1 (bumper) must be 16 years old and those applying for a Category A3 (Point-to-Point) must be 17 years old.

To obtain their license applicants will have to complete a number of tasks depending on their license type such as a 2-day induction course in RACE, an interview, a medical examination and baseline concussion test and a practical test/assessment.



Jockey Supports & Services

The Jockey Pathway

The Jockey Pathway is a completely FREE SERVICE funded by equuip, which is open to all professional jockeys in Ireland. It includes access to Strength & Conditioning Training, Dietitian, Sports Psychologist, a Career Support & Transition service and On-Course Physiotherapy.

Irish Injured Jockeys

The IIJ was set up in 2014 to increase awareness and raise vital funds to support injured jockeys. Funds raised are used to provide appropriate support, financial or otherwise, in a prompt and sympathetic manner to jockeys past or present who are injured, unable to ride or generally in need.

The Irish Jockeys Trust

Provides care, support and financial help to injured, incapacitated & aged jockeys and apprentices.





